XI INTERNATIONAL VOCATIONAL TRAINING COMPETITION

The Organizing Committee of the 11th International Vocational Training Competition, at its meetings held in Madrid (Spain) on 15 and 16 march, 1962, decided to hold this eleventh competition at Gijon, in Spain. as from 1 september, 1962,

Competitors will be divided into two groups or categories, according to age, Category A will include all those born in 1941, 1942, or 1943; and Category B, those born in 1944, 1945 or 1946.

In competitions in trades for which only one category («Single Category») is allowed, all those who wish to take part may do so, whatever their age, provided this is not outside the limits fixed for Categories A and B.

The Competition will be run by the Organizing Committee, which comprises one official, and one technical representative of each of the participating countries.

The expenses of running the competition and those incurred by participants will be provided for as follows:

- 1. Competitors, travelling expenses both ways, and expenses of commuting to and from the place where the competition is held, will be paid by their respective countries.
- 2. Board and lodging expenses and the general organizing expenses will be paid by the country in which the competition is held.

Winners will be awarded trophies, diplomas, etc., and an Attendance Certificate will be issued to all those taking part in the competition, by the President of the Organizing Committee.


On the occasion of the 11th International Vocational Training Competition, instructive visits and excursions will be organized outside the days and times fixed for the competition tests.






