

6 Top Facts About London

1. Multicultural

The 7.2 million inhabitants of London come from all across the world and speak some 300 different languages. Around a guarter of people working in London were born overseas.

2. Accessible

London has five international airports that handle more than 120 million people every year – with Heathrow the busiest. Millions more arrive via the Eurostar at Waterloo Station. The capital has an integrated transport network and rail links reach out from London to the corners of England, Scotland and Wales.

3. Powerful

London has the fourth largest economy in the world. For the 15th consecutive year the European Cities Monitor has named London as Europe's Best City for Business. Three-quarters of business visitors make a return trip to the capital.

4. Entertaining

London is the tastiest place on the planet to eat, according to Gourmet magazine of the US, coming in ahead of Paris, Rome and New York. In 2005, London has 36 Michelin star-rated restaurants. In total there are more than 6,000 restaurants in the capital and 3,800 pubs. And with 150 theatres, there's bound to be something for everyone.

5. Talented

Greater London has an estimated total labour pool of 3.5m, supplemented by a further 4m in the region around London.

6. Unique

With such a huge array of unique venues, a wealth of accommodation possibilities and a strong business infrastructure, London is the world's premier conference and meeting destination.

All competitors will have access to internet facilities and will be able to keep in touch with family and friends at home with a complimentary international calling card. 





