TEAM - CHECK LIST

Remember to bring :

1. PASSPORT and VISA
2. UNIFORMS as issued. You will travel to Australia in your casual wear as issued. This important for official photographs.
3. CLOTHING It will probably be hot in the daytime (70 to 80 F) but it will be cooler in the evenings. Don't forget swimwear.
4. TOOLS if you have not sent them on under separate cover.
5. LUGGAGE maximum permissible weight is 20 Kgm or 44 pounds and normally not more than TWO items of hand luggage.
6. MEDICAL SUPPLIES You may wish to take tablets for headaches, stomach upsets or any special diets, etc.
7. SPENDING MONEY in Travellers' Cheques, Credit Cards and/or Australian currency. Allow for the odd meal and presents to take home, etc.
