COMPETITORS' PROFILES

Skill No.1 Fitting - Andrew J Connell

Andrew was the winner in the Fitting section of the 'Best of British' Engineering National Competition held at the EITB Training Centre, Sheffield. He is presently awaiting examination results of a Higher National Certificate in Engineering taken at the Lancashire Polytechnic having previously gained his Ordinary National Certificate. He received 12 weeks pre-competition training working on specially designed test pieces. Andrew is employed by British Aerospace (Military Aircraft) Ltd., Warton Aerodrome, Preston. At the competition marks were lost on accuracy due to the time factor, but he proved himself to be a very determined and co-operative competitor.

Skill No.2 Press Toolmaking - Paul B Phillips

Paul was the winner in the Press Toolmaking section of the 'Best of British' Engineering National Competition. He has gained an ONC and HNC in Production Engineering studying at Oxford Polytechnic. Paul was removed from Production work for 6 months prior to the Competition in order to develop improved techniques. He also received pre-competition training with Bridgeport and Sandvick. Paul is employed by Rover Group Cowley Operations. Throughout the International Competition Paul worked very well producing a good standard of craftsmanship and finishing within the allocated time. However he encountered some difficulty with the assembly of his tool which cost him vital marks.

Skill No.3 Instrument Making - Brendan J Conway

Brendan qualified for selection at the 'Best of British' Engineering National Competition. He received six weeks pre-competition training on specially designed Skill Olympics exercises. He studied at the Oxford College of Further Education and obtained a B/Tech Mechanical Engineering Diploma at Level III standard (20 Units). Brendan worked well at the competition but was defeated by the time factor. He was a most co-operative competitor and won the 'Hill Award' which is presented to the UK Team Member contributing the most to the team effort. Brendan is presently employed by Austin Rover, Cowley Body Plant, Cowley, Oxford.

Skill No.5 Engineering Drawing - Tina MacLean

Tina recently moved from Scotland to work at Jaguar Cars Ltd., Radford, Coventry. She is intending to pursue studies in Mechanical Engineering at Birmingham University in October 1989. She was selected for the UK Team by means of interview by Skill-UK Technical Delegate and her employers, and was given in-company pre-competition training. Tina worked well at the competition although initially she found the pressure intimidating. Owing to her late selection, Tina was not able to be present at the Skill-UK Briefing Week-end; she nevertheless proved to be an able competitor and a credit to the team.

Skill No.6 Turning - Stephen Weldon

Stephen was the winner in the Turning section of the 'Best of British' Engineering National Competition. He studied at Yeovil College and gained City and Guilds certificates in Course 205 Parts I and II. Stephen commenced training on a Youth Training Scheme and is presently employed by Normalair Garret Ltd. Yeovil, and given pre-competition training on past competition exercises. Stephen produced excellent work at the International Competition, but timing proved to be a problem - he used the full time of 22 hours to complete his piece; consequently no time was availalable for 'finishing off' which cost him marks. He was awarded a Diploma of Merit for his high standard of workmanship.

Skill No.7 Milling - Stuart Pollock

Stuart was selected for the UK Team by competing in the 'Best of British' Engineering National Competition. He studied at Telford College, Edinburgh and obtained SCOTEC certificates in appropriate subjects. He has also qualified in EITB modules of Turning, Milling, CNC, Measurement and Inspection. Stuart was given 5 weeks precompetition training at both his own place of employment, Ferranti International, Edinburgh, and specialised work at Bridgeport of Leicester. Stuart's position of work at the competition site was close to the public walkway which may have affected his concentration, but he managed to do a good job in spite of losing out on accuracy and finish quality.

Skill No. 8 Construction Steelwork - David Bradshaw

David was the winner of a National Competition organised by the British Constructional Steelwork Association and held at the Bolton Metropolitan College. He studied at this college and obtained CGLI certificates in courses 200, 217 Parts II and III with credits and distinction. David is presently employed by Caunce Bros. Ltd. Mawdesley, Lancs. having received YTS training. In preparation for the competition he was given 5 days specialised instruction at the Bolton Metropolitan College. David worked well after a nervous start and may have featured among the award perseverence in spite of this disappointing set-back earned him great

Skill No. 9 Gas Welding - Simon Thurstan

Simon was selected by means of a National Competition organised by Heating and Ventilating Companies in conjunction with staff of the Openshaw Technical College, Manchester. He has gained by his studies at the College CGLI certificates in courses 591 and 599 (with distinctions and credits) and the Heating & Ventilating and D.E.N.J.I. Council Award Silver Medal for Oxy-Acetylene Welding. He is presently employed by Drake and Skull Eng. Manchester having qualified on a YTS Course. In preparation for the competition Simon was given 15 days specialised training with Bowford Engineering (Liverpool & Washington) and 10 days with his Skill-UK Expert. He worked hard at his test-piece but found the time limit difficult, such that he was unable to put a good

Skill No.10 Electric Welding - Darren Blakemore

Darren was selected by means of a National Competition which took place at his place of employment Babcock Power Ltd., Tipton, W.Midlands. He studied at the Dudley College of Technology where he gained the CGLI course 165 Advance Welding Certificate with credits. Darren was given pre-competition training at TIG Welding, Wales, BOC Cryer Plant, International Combustion NEI and the local College. After a hesitant start he improved in his work as time went on, but was conscious of stiff opposition and a very demanding exercise.

Skill No. 11 Wood Patternmaking - Robert Davison

Robert was selected by means of a National Competition in two qualifying stages, organised by the Institute of British Foundrymen and the EITB. The final stage was held at the Metcom Centre, Falkirk. He studied at the Derby College of Further Education where he gained CGL1 certifictes in Patternmaking Craft Studies Parts I and II with distinctions. Robert is employed at his father's company where he was given specialised precompetition training supervised by the Skill-UK Expert. He worked well being unaffected by distraction or pressure but was able to concentrate on the job in hand. After carefully assessing the exercise, he planned his procedure and paced himself perfectly to take full advantage of the allocated time. Robert was awarded a well

Skill No.13 Panel Beating - Paul Mackenzie

Paul was elected by means of a selection test and an interview. He studied at the Nene College, Northampton where he gained CGL1 Certificates in Sheet Metal and Thin Plate Craft Studies Parts I, II and III with credits and distinctions. In preparation for the IYSO, Paul received 8 weeks of concentrated pre-competition training at his employer's premises Airflow Streamlines, Far Cotton, Northants. Unfortunately due to mistakes in the initial marking out stage he was not among the winners, but he worked well and obtained a good mark.

Skill No.l4 Sheet Metalwork - Jason Masser

Jason was the winner of the National Competition in Sheet Metalwork sponsored by the Institute of Sheet Metalwork Engineering and held at the EITB Training Centre, Sheffield. He studied at the Anglia College, Chelmsford, Essex and gained a Higher National Certificate in Fabrication and Welding. Ten weeks of pre-competition training was given at the EITB Training Centre and his place of employment the Ford Motor Co. Ltd., S.Ockendon, Essex. Jason made a very good start in the International Competition and completed his exercise within the allocated time. However, as is so often the case in this trade he lost marks on accuracy.

Skill No.15 Plumbing - Darren Burford

Darren was selected by means of the JIB National Plumbing ompetition in 1987. He studied at the South East London College of Technology and gained CGLI Craft and Advanced Craft Certificates in Plumbing and the l

Plumber Welder Certificate all with distinctions.

Darren also received 10 weeks pre-competition training at his college in close liaison with his course tutor, his employer Rosser & Russell Building Services Ltd. London, and Skill UK Expert. He commenced his initial training on a YTS course at the college. The standard of workmanship demonstrated by Darren was excellent, but concentrating on quality he just failed to complete the exercise. He was awarded a Diploma of Merit.

Skill No.16 Industrial Electronics - Paul Field

Paul was selected from the Industrial Electronics National Competition the final of which was held at the GEC/Marconi premises at Portsmouth. He holds an Ordinary National Certificate in Industrial Electronics and is pursuing studies at the Bedford College of Higher Education for a Higher National Certificate in his subject. Paul also holds the Duke of Edinburgh Gold Award. His present employer is the MOD. Royal Aircraft Establishment, Bedford. In preparation for the International Competition Paul received pre-competition training on past-competition exercises at MOD Farnborough and EITB Training Centre at Croydon, in addition to studying a correspondence course. He displayed a very high standard of ability in his work but found some difficulty in pacing himself against such a demanding time schedule. Paul was awarded a Diploma of Merit in recognition of his achievement.

Skill No.17 Consumer Electronics (Radio & TV Repair) - Stephen Bainbridge

Stephen was selected by a National Competition held at the Brunel Technical College, Bristol and organised by the Radio, Television and Electronics Examination Board. He attended the Wirral Metropolitan . College, Merseyside, where he gained CGLI Course Certificates parts I, II and III with distinctions. Paul received pre-competition training at South Bristol Technical College, MOD. DGDQA AQUILA and at his place of employment Radio Rentals Ltd. Although Stephen is of a quiet disposition and found working under pressure and in the public eye difficult, his high standard of workmanship gained him a Diploma of Merit.

Skill No.18 Consumer Wiring (House Wiring) - Alan R Murphy

Alan was selected by means of a National Competition held at the Leicester Skill Centre and organised by the Electrical Contractors' Association. He studied at the Matthew Boulton Technical College, Birmingham where he gained CGLI certificates in Electrical Installation Course No. 236 Parts I, II and III with distinctions. He also gained an Ordinary National Certificate in Building Services (Electrical) with distinctions and credits. Alan commenced his training on a 1 year Youth Training Scheme. Paul spent five and a half weeks 'off the job' precompetition training with his company How Engineering Services Ltd. West Bromwich. He was an excellent competitor, worked with enthusiasm and produced outstanding quality of work for which he was awarded a Bronze Medal.

Skill No.19 Industrial Wiring - Shaun W Greaves

Shaun was selected by means of a National Competition organised by the Electrical Contractors' Association and held at the Leicester Skill Centre. He studied at the Burton-on-Trent Technical College where he gained CGLI certificates for Course 236 Parts I, II and III with distinctions and also passes in the AM2 examinations. In preparation for the International Competition, Shaun was given five and a half weeks pre-competition training by his employer W T Parker Group, Burton-on-Trent, CEGB, and Concorde Temperature Controls Ltd. Hard work, dedication and attention to detail were key elements which enabled him to be awarded a Bronze Medal.

Skill No.20 Bricklaying - Stephen Bayles

Stephen was the winner of the Bricklaying section of the Skill-Build National Competition held at Parkwood Colege, Sheffield. He studied at the Suffolk College, Ipswich, and gained CGLI Craft and Advanced Craft Certificates in Brickwork with distinctions. He commenced his training on a CITB 1 year YTS course and is presently employed by A M Bayles (Anglia) Ltd. Westerfield. Stephen received four separate weeks of precompetition training at Suffolk College. He worked very well without being influenced by pressure under competition conditions to produce an excellent test piece which earned him a Silver Medal.

Skill No.21 Stonemasonry - Richard P McCrone

Richard was the winner in the Stonemasonry section of the Skill-Build National Competition via the Inter-Cities preliminary round. He studied at Bath College of Further Education and gained the CGLI Craft Course in Masonry with distinctions. He commenced his training on a 2 year YTS course and is employed in his father's business Philip McCrone Builders, Corby, Northants. Richard was released by his employer for four weeks pre-competition training at the Bath College of FE. He worked very hard and well but became over-concerned about the limited time available and forfeited accuracy as a consequence.

Skill No.22 Painting and Decorating - Jason Yates

Jason was winner in the Painting and Decorating section of the Skill-Build National Competition. He studied at Cauldon College of Further Education, Stoke-on-Trent and gained CGLI certificates in Advanced Painting and Decorating with distinctions, Signwriting (craft) Teacher's Certificate 730 and Colour in Building Work. Jason was given four weeks pre-competition training at the Cauldon College and is presently employed by the Stoke-on Trent City Works Department. Jason obtained good marks in paperhanging and texturing in the International Competition but lost out on other more basic skills.

Skill No.23 Plasterwork - Alex C Aitken

Alex gained entry to the UK Team by qualifying in the Plastering section of the Skill-Build National Competition. He studied at the Vauxhall College, London and gained CGLI Craft and Advanced Craft Certificates in Plasterwork with credits and distinctions. He commenced his training

on a YTS course and is now employed by Fibreforn Mouldings Ltd. (Profiles), Coventry. Alex received pre-competition training at the --Vauxhall College. He worked hard at his Competition project but found the stresses and strains very difficult. Unfortunately due to illness, Alex was unable to attend the Briefing Week-end when vital advice was given on how to cope with competition conditions.

Skill No.24 Cabinet Making - Richard Mason

Richard was selected to represent his country by winning the Cabinet Making section of the Skill-Build National Competition. He studied at the Keighley Technical Coplege and gained CGLI Craft Certificates in Joinery and Carpentry, and Wood Machining with distinctions. He was given pre-competition training by his employer D G Gape (Cabinet Makers & Joiners) Ltd. Skipton. in conjunction with his Skill-UK Expert. Richard after a hesitant start worked very well and produced excellent work which earned him a Diploma of Merit.

Skill No.25 Joinery - Christopher I Mawdsley

Christopher was the winner in the Joinery section of the Skill-Build National Competition. He studied at the W R Tuson College Preston, where he gained CGLI Craft and Advance Craft certificates with distinctions and credits. Christopher commenced his training on a YTS course at the college and is presently employed by British Nuclear Fuels PLC. Salwick, Lancs. He was given generous pre-competition training at his place of employment and was released for four weeks intensive training at the College. At the International Competition Christopher produced some excellent work, his approach and method of working being faultless and but for one error for which he was penalised, he would have been among the medal winners. Nevertheless his high standard of work was such as to qualify for a Diploma of Merit.

Skill No.26 Carpentry - Paul G Magorrian

Paul was the winner in the Carpentry section of the Skill-Build National Competition. He studied at the Down College of Further Education, Ballynahinch. Northern Ireland, where he gained CGLI Certificates in Carpentry and Joinery at both Craft and Advanced Craft levels with distinctions. He also hold CGLI certificates for Building Measurement and costs, and Surveying and Levelling. He is at present employed by Chris.Brown, Newcastle, Co. Down, N.I. Paul was given 7 weeks of intensive pre-competition training at the College. At the International Competition, although Paul produced work of an outstanding quality, he mis-judged the time allocation and was unable to finish his exercise.

Skill No. 27 Jewellery - David J Slingsby

David, was the runner-up in the selection test used for the UK team in the 1988 IYSO, and was chosen as the 1989 competitor being still within the permissible age range. He stuidied at the Sir John Cass College, London, and gained CGLI certificates in Jewellery at both Craft and Advance Craft levels with distinctions. He also won 1st Prize in both the British Jewellers' Association and the Worshipful Company of Goldsmiths Craft Council Awards. He was given the opportunity to practice on past competition test pieces at his employer's premises C A Treble, London. At the International Competition David worked very well coping with the pressure of competition conditions, but had some difficulty with maintaining the dimensions which prevented his winning a medal.

Skill No.29 Ladies' Hairdressing - Nicola Heaven

Nicola was selected at the Hairdressing National Competition held in Blackpool after several eliminating stages. She studied at the Brunel Technical College, Bristol where she gained CGLI course 301 certificates in Practical Assessments, Design Studies, Science Studies, Cosmetic Make-up and Manicure, with distinctions. She has also won the Golden Scissors award sponsored by Wella. She is presently employed by Mrs Margaret Mills, Wotton-under-Edge, Glos. Nicola did extensive pre-competition training by courtesy of her employer, several visiting specialists at the College and at considerable sacrifice of her own free time. This effort was reflected in the very high standard of work accomplished at the NEC for which she was awarded a Silver Medal.

Skill No.30 Men's Hairdressing – Nicholas I Williams-Cammack

Nicholas was selected via the Hairdressing National Competition held in He studied at the Mid-Blackpool, after winning the regional final. Warwickshire College, Leamington Spa, and gained CGLI course 301 certificates in Hairdressing Practices, Practical Assessments, Design Studies and Science Studies. He is presently employed by Robert John (Hairstylists) Weston-Super-Mare. Nick received extensive precompetition training from May, developing progressively until August At the International Competition he worked steadily throughout 1989. His work was of the highest after an initial settling in period. standard for which he was awarded the Gold Medal. On completion, Nick commented that it was the most difficult competition he had ever encountered.

Skill No.31 - Garment Production (Ladies' Dressmaking) - Ian S Costello

Ian was selected for the United Kingdom team as the winner of the 'Go for Gold' National Competition held at the London College of Fashion He has qualified in the CGLI Course where he also studied. Nos. 460 stages I, II, and III Handicraft Tailoring and Bespoke Cutting, Women's Production Cutting stage III and Management and Supervisory He is employed byhis father, Costello & Robey, Ilford, Essex. Skills. after commencing his training on a 1 year YTS course. lan was given pre-competition training at Lerose Ltd, Toye Kenning and Spencer, Oddessy, Saville Row and a period with the 1988 UK Competitor Katherine During the initial stages of the International Competition Forster. lan suffered from a severe cold and was also conscious of the close proximity of the watching public. Nevertheless, he worked very well and produced an excellent Competition piece for which he was awarded the Silver Medal.

Skill No.32 CNC Machining - Stephen P Porter

Stephen was selected by means of an Eliminating Test held at Solihull Technical College where candidates had initially been selected from CGLI Advanced Programming Examination results. He studied at the Brunel Technical College, Bristol, where he gained CGLI Craft and Advance Craft Studies, Certificates in Computer Aided Engineering, CNC Machine setting and Operation and CNC Part and Advanced Part Programming with distinctions. He commenced his training on a YTS course and is now employed by British Aerospace PLC, (Dynamics Division) Bristol. Stephen received pre-competition training at Bridgport and Colchester, the Brunel Technical College and extensive in-company practise with his employer. He prepared enthusiastically for the International Competition and is obviously a very competent skilled craftsman, but due to inexperience of competition conditions he made a few mistakes which cost him a medal winning position.

Skill NO.33 Auto Mechanics - Nicholas Partington

Nicholas was elected to the UK Team by qualifying in the RTITB 'Young Mechanic of the Year' National Competition held at MOTEC High Ercall in He studied at the Bolton Metropolitan College where he gained 1988: CGLI course certificates at parts I, II, and III with distinctions. He has also been awarded several 'trade' trophies for his achievements He is an Associate of the Institute of the Motor during training. Nicholas commenced his Training on a YTS course and is now lndustry. employed by the Radcliffe Road Garage Co. Ltd., Bolton. Nicholas pursued a full programme of pre-competition training with major motor and equipment manufacturers, the RTITB and received considerable assistance from the 1988 'Gold Medal' winner Andrew Delaney. At the International Competition he proved to be an excellent competitor and, despite the pressure of defending a Gold Medal on his home ground, his standard of work was such that he was awarded a Silver Medal.

Skill No.34 Cookery - Stephen C Brown

Stephen was selected for the UK Team from the Young Chef of the Year National Competition which is sponsored by American Express and organised and administrated by the Hotel and Catering Training Board. He studied at the Henley-on-Thames Technical College where he gained CGLI Certificates in courses 705,706 and 707 with distinctions. He is presently employed at the Dinham Hall Hotel, Ludlow, Shropshire. In preparation for the Internation Competition Stephen was given precompetition training at the Cifton Arms Hotel, Lytham, Sharrow Bay Hotel, Ullswater and at the Royal Naval Cookery School in Aldershot. He worked very well throughout the three and a half days under competition pressure and before an audience. For his high standard of workmanship he was awarded a **Diploma of Merit**.

Skill No.35 Waiting - J Scott Hendry

Scott was chosen to represent his country in the IYSO by qualifying in the Young Waiter of the Year National Competition which is sponsored by American Express and organised and administrated by the Hotel and Catering Training Board. He is employed by the Marine Highland Hotel, Troon, Scotland, and was awarded the Scottish Highland Hotels Chairman's Award. Scott's pre-competition training included intensive tuition at the Birmingham College of Food and Technology, and at his place of employment. His even temperament enabled him to maintain a calm approach during the days of competition at the NEC in a trade which attracted a great deal of attention from the public. He was dressed immaculately at all times and performed so well that he gained a Diploma of Merit.

Skill No.36 Graphic Arts - Gina Taylor

Gina was selected from college examination results and interview, for inclusion in the UK Team. She possesses a range of GCE subjects including Art at 'O' and 'A' Levels and has qualified in the Foundation Course. Gina attended the Coventry Technical College for her studies and is employed by Allen Screenprint Limited, Coventry. She received some pre-competition training at both the college and by working on appropriate production at her place of employment. This being the first time UK has entered a competitor for this particular skill, Gina worked very well and gained valuable experience.

Skill No. 37 Agricultural Mechanics - Simon Lowdell

Simon was selected for the UK Team by means of regional heats leading to the National Competition held at the Rycotewood College, Thame, Oxon., in conjunction with BAGMA. He studied at the South Kent College, Canterbury, Kent where he gained CGLI Certificates in Motor Vehicle Craft Studies Part I and Agricultural Mechanics Parts I, II and III with distinctions. Simon commenced his training on a YTS course and is presently employed by Invicta Motors Ltd. (Agricultural Division) Canterbury, Kent. Simon was given pre-competition by several local dealers on different types of equipment. He worked very well at the International Competition possessing an even temperament which helped him to cope with competition pressure. For the excellent standard of work he produced he was awarded a Bronze Medal. Simon was married the day before the Closing Ceremony but to his credit he attended the function which earned him a special round of applause.

THE HILL AWARD

This award donated to Skill-UK by its founder Chairman Fred Hill MBE, is in the form of a shield which is presented to the member of the UK Team of Competitors who made the greatest overall contribution to the success and well being of the UK Team throughout the whole period from selection to the post International Competition dispersal. This year the Hill Award is to be presented to Brendan J Conway who competed in the skill of Instrument Making and is employed by Austin Rover. He emerged as a natural leader first of all at the Briefing Week-end. During the whole time at the NEC, although experiencing some difficulties with his own test-piece, he maintained a high attitude of enthusiasm, and was able to motivate the rest of the Team to give of their best, thus ensuring that the morale of the competitors was kept high. After the actual competition, Brendon helped to keep the Team in high spirits and was a great assistance to the two UK Team Leaders.
