29th INTERNATIONAL SKILL OLYMPICS

During four days 354 young people - more than ever before - from 19 member countries showed their skills and know-how in 34 trades. About 200 experts had to prepare test projects and do the marking. 40 official and technical delegates, dozens of official observers from all over the world and tens of thousands of Australian visitors took part in the event.

In addition to the official competition, young people competed in 11 demonstration trades, with the aim of testing possible new trades for future Skill Olympics (see list of trades in appendix 1).

Experts' training

For the first time experts and shopmasters had a meeting to orientate themselves on the preparation and development of the competition. Messrs. Kim (K), Schropp (D), Nigsch (FL), Beuk (NL) and Blattner (A) explained the main issues. Mr. Beuk (NL) informed individually on the new standardized marking system which was discussed in detail and which was met with general approval.

Selection of test projects

The jury-commissions did an excellent job. However, due to special circumstances, trades 33 and 37 needed almost twice the time originally assessed. The briefing of competitors on the marking system - a quite justified request - led to a 50% increase in translation and paper work. If there had not have been a World Congress just before the competition, test projects would not have been ready in time. The Technical Committee should discuss this matter in view of future competitions.

In some trades experts have not followed the rule that one test project should be selected from the various projects presented. It takes too much

time to work out a complete new test project, and in the future this should be avoided. (Selection of test projects in appendix 2). The experts' excellent work was actually not properly rewarded, because there was not enough time to have a special excursion. At the next competition we shall take this fact into consideration; there should be enough time to visit some parts of the host country. Only one expert failed to comply with the rule that every expert must present a complete test project. This expert was excluded from further work.

Chief experts

For the first time the jury-commissions appointed chief experts for the competition. These competent and responsible experts adapted well to the new situation, and the system proved to be efficient. (List of chief experts in appendix 3).

Trade descriptions

In accordance with a decision of the Technical Committee, all trade descriptions will be revised and adapted to new standards. During the 30th IVTC the jury-commissions will spend an extra day on examining the details. All trade descriptions should be revised and updated by the 31st Skill Olympics.

Competition venue

A great effort was needed to finish the construction of the Exhibition Centre in time for the competition. The architectural design of the Centre is most interesting and impressive.

Thanks to the tenacity and hard work of Mr. Jones' (AUS) big team, working places were ready in time and everything was well installed. The effort is very much appreciated.

Note: For every halfday, competitors had a half-hour break with refreshments.

In addition, before the competition candidates had several hours for installing their working places and getting acquainted with machines and equipment.

Opening ceremony

About 8.000 persons took part in the opening ceremony of the 29th IVTC, the first Skill Olympics in the Southern Hemisphere. The programme was directed specially towards young people and met with approval.

Competition

In the large open-plan Centre visitors could easily obtain a clear general view of competitors' work.

120.000 visitors strolled along the working places and appreciated the atmosphere of a trade-show or skills exhibition.

During scheduled breaks, competitors had the opportunity of taking a look at different trades. The food served was excellent and the youngsters showed high performance and efficiency. It is hardly possible to describe the atmosphere that prevailed during the four days; the competition was an outstanding event.

General programme

Competitors were housed in colleges not far from the Exhibition Centre; they enjoyed some organised excursions and - through the celebration of the World Congress - a pleasant period of familiarisation, a fact which was generally appreciated and which increased efficiency.

Delegates, observers and experts had a few excursions which contributed to a general exchange of ideas.

World Congress

500 people participated in the 2nd World Congress of Vocational Training. Congress members made visits and had discussions in small groups. The Australian host will inform on details. Organising the Congress with its various working groups and different languages was a real masterpiece.

Technical Committee

The Technical Committee had an informal meeting daily to discuss matters referring to the competition.

During the first official meeting where for the first time simultaneous translation was introduced, Mr. Z.Z. Kim (K) was elected Chairman and Mr. Beuk (NL) Vice-Chairman. The Committee approved the Competition Rules and the revision of the trade descriptions.

During the second official meeting delegates took note of the marking of the jury-commissions and went over questions concerning the competition. (For details see minutes).

Administrative Committee

Under the chairmanship of Mr. Wang (ROC), the Committee had two meetings. Delegates approved the 1987 annual accounts and the 1988 budget, the Competition Rules and the revision of the trade descriptions. (For details see minutes).

General Assembly

The General Assembly met twice under the chairmanship of President F. Albert (E). Members discussed current affairs, approved proposals from the Committees and the calendar for the forthcoming year. Finland was admitted as new Member. (For details see minutes).

All terms of office expire at the end of 1989, except the term of the Secretary-General, who was elected till 1991. (For list of delegates' addresses see appendix 5).

Marking of test projects

Marking took two days, following the normal procedure. In a few trades there were difficulties in conveying results on "form 6". As a consequence, the computer needed more time than planned for the conversion into the 400-600 point system. The computer programme as a whole has proved efficient. (For experts' list see appendix 4).

Due to the fact that before the competition marking criteria had been clearly defined and marking divided into objective and subjective classifications, test projects as a whole had a fair marking. Competitors had been acquainted with marking criteria before the competition.

A few shortcomings in the preparation of the test projects and the marking procedure have been discussed and will be dealt with.

Any doubts as to the new trade "plant mechanics" were easily overcome, but trade CNC had almost insurmountable technical problems. A good team of experts was able to solve difficulties and adapt marking criteria to normal standards.





Ranking is less important than the possibility to learn. As a whole, it is encouraging that more countries than before have achieved good results; USA and EIR have made progress. In this respect we wish to point out that at the beginning the Asian Members were not very successful; Members who did not receive any medal will have a good chance to be successful in the near future.

More than a fight for medals

Participating in an International Vocational Training Competition is an unforgettable experience for everyone. The aim of any young competitor is, of course, to be a winner. A visible recognition of effort and skill is appreciated in all countries.

Nevertheless, conversations, contacts and exchange of experience among participants of all countries are by no means less important. A lifetime friendship can develop between people of all ages. Besides, everybody learns that hard work and constant effort lead to achieving the goal; that only real efficiency brings personal satisfaction.

The competition offers the possibility of understanding and appreciating a foreign country and its inhabitants. It is well known that the competitions are also an opportunity for creating economic contacts.

Finally, the possible feedback on one's own vocational training system is of special interest. Anybody who watches skilled persons from different continents at work, will immediately notice which are the differences in the working techniques and processes, and that there are even important differences in the way they use tools or machines.

The idea of friendly contests between young skilled workers from the whole world has won recognition. Nowadays, when effort is regarded by many youngsters as a burden, these spontaneous contacts on an international level are especially valuable.

Closing ceremony

The closing of the Skill Olympics was celebrated as usual, in two parts. During the first part the official awards were handed out to the winning competitors of all trades; closing speeches were made; former technical delegates Dressel (D) and Wilbanks (USA) received Honorary Membership, and Mr. Fontes (SENAI), initiator and organiser of the 1st World Congress in Rio de Janeiro, received the Diploma of Honour.

In the evening all competitors, delegates, observers and friends of the Skill Olympics met for an open air party in order to have a last friendly exchange of ideas and experiences.

Future events

At the meetings in Sydney delegates were already informed of the 30th Skill Olympics which will take place between August 21 and September 4. The Organising Committee has already started preparations in a most efficient way; so there is reason to expect that Birmingham (UK) will be another successful event in the history of the Skill Olympics.

Brief information has also been given on the 31st IVTC which will take place in Amsterdam (NL) in June 1991. The 32nd Skill Olympics will be celebrated in 1993 in Taiwan.

The combination of Skill Olympics and World Congress has, against quite a few advantages, the disadvantage that the events take too much time. The question has come up whether it would not be suitable to hold an event of this kind in the year between two competitions. But even so, during the Skill Olympics some seminars on the vocational training system of the host country should be organised.
