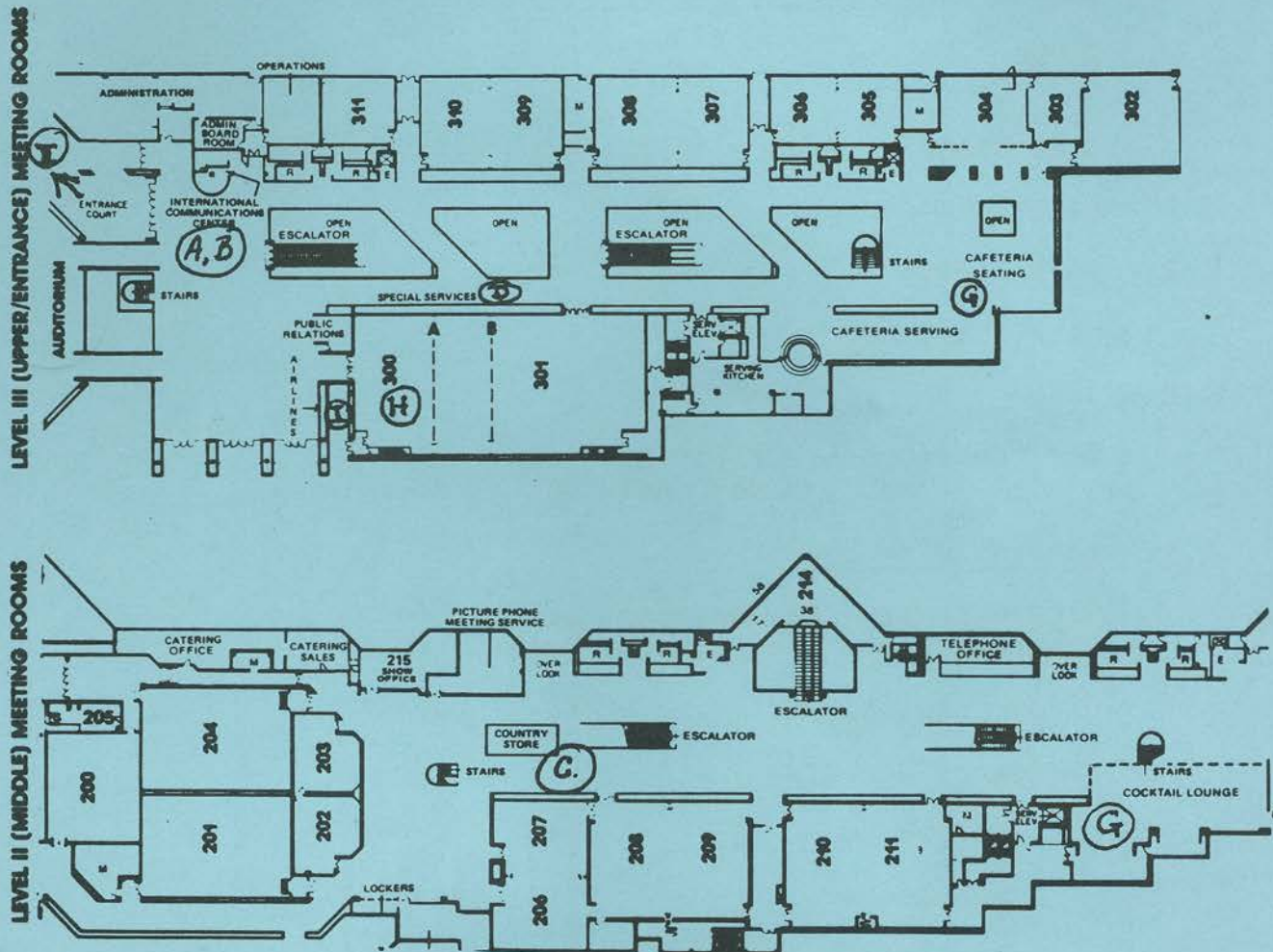

DEMONSTRATION

Commercial Art

Aim:

Participation in the international competition of vocational training. Commercial artists design all visuals of the field of graphics and prepare camera ready art for the production of such designs. Commercial artists around the world adhere to the basic art design concepts and principles but because of the geo-graphics artists around the world may resolve the same problem differently.

Designs and layouts are prepared for various methods of reproduction; letterpress, offset, intaglio, silk screen, film and television.

Skills required:

Care and use of the tools of the trade.

"T" square, triangle, ruling pen, pen and ink, pencil, brushes, ruler, all art mediums, the airbrush, felt pens.

Knowledge:

Concepts and principles of design and composition, the theory of color, concepts and principles of graphic design, thorough understanding of the methods of reproduction, knowledge of rendering roughs through comprehensives, thorough knowledge of the preparation of mechanicals or key art (camera ready art), knowledge and sensitivity of the use of typography.

Test Projects:

- (1) Full color illustration for a short story
- (2) Roughs, layouts to comprehensives of a 3 color advertisement
- (3) Mechanicals, keys or camera ready art for that 3 color advertisement
