orldSkills, UK Alumni member Will Torrent (Team UK 2007) is currently involved in an exciting new collaboration between supermarket giant Waitrose and Michelin starred celebrity chef, Heston Blumenthal which will see him help create new desserts for Waitrose.

It all began just before Christmas 2010 when a Waitrose director spotted the talents of confectioner and pastry chef Will, who is just 24 years old. He introduced him to the executive chef of Waitrose, Neil Nugent, and following this, Neil asked the budding chef to work with Heston to help Waitrose create a range of desserts that would knock the spots off those from rival supermarkets. Never one to shy away from a challenge, Will accepted.

Will first met Heston when he was a teenager, studying at a school which was just around the corner from Heston's now famous Fat Duck restaurant in Berkshire. Aged just 15, Will had never heard of Heston as he was yet to hit the headlines; so he was completely unaware how the one week he spent there as a work experience student would shape his future. Having started his career with Heston, Will is now relishing the opportunity to link up with him again. The pair have just finished designing a Royal wedding dessert, which will go on sale at Waitrose a week before the Royal Wedding of HRH Prince William and Kate Middleton and will be available throughout the rest of the summer. The recipe is a marriage of two classic British desserts, a trifle and the Eton Mess and the ingredients include; cream infused with saffron, Amaretti biscuits soaked in brandy, strawberry compote, meringue and rose petals.

Will recently returned from Celtic Manor in Wales where he cooked the dessert for 350 Waitrose delegates and senior management as well as Delia Smith. The event was held to inspire the supermarket's workforce as they implement new policies and launch their new products.

There are plenty more exciting opportunities on the horizon for Will as he prepares to cook for the Chairman of John Lewis, Charlie Mayfield, alongside 180 other guests at Partnership House in London. The guests will be treated to some of Will's signature creations such as Will's Popping Rockets, Jaffilionaires, Pistachio and Christmas Tree Extract Madeleines and Meringue Wands.

With a number of potential BBC projects also in the pipeline for Will it looks like we may soon have another celebrity chef as part of the WorldSkills, UK Alumni.

Going Global 2011 - World education: the new powerhouse?

Adam Smith (Team UK 2009) joined Simon Bartley, President-elect of WorldSkills International for Going Global 2011. The Going Global conference, organised by the British Council focuses on the challenges facing education as city and nation states battle to emerge from global recession. For the first time in its four year existence the conference was held outside the UK at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre.

As part of the conference Adam and Hong Kong's Cooking Expert, Andreas Muller judged a skills competition between UK and Hong Kong colleges. Students from Westminster Kingsway College, Lewisham College and Hackney College joined their peers in Hong Kong to compete in a one day competition. The students then took part in a competitive food preparation demonstration organised and judged by Adam, which formed part of the conference program.

There are many opportunities to share your experiences as a past competitor, and in doing so, inspire others to improve their skills. Examples of this may be talking to the media, speaking at a UK Skills or sector event, or providing case studies to promote practical vocational education and learning. To help them, World Skills London 2011, working in partnership with learning providers, has developed a high quality programme of activities and teaching resources. These 'Education Experience' materials aim to spark the imagination of young people and support vocational learning and skills development.

By volunteering to help at the event you can support this programme and help enhance the impact of the Education Experience.

Learning at WorldSkills London 2011

The Education Experience consists of three distinct strands:

Strand one is aimed at schools and colleges. Teachers, lecturers and education providers can download these resources from the education section of the WorldSkills London 2011 website to integrate into their existing teaching and learning programmes. A separate component of strand one, 'One School, One Country', will give up to 53 primary schools, within the London boroughs, the opportunity to welcome and host international competitors and delegates at their schools.

Strand two gives students at selected colleges the opportunity to undertake practical activities which will be assessed at WorldSkills London 2011. This work will lead to the award of a unit of credit towards the student's qualification.

Strand three focuses on enhancing the Education Experience at the event. By using these resources teachers will be able to prepare students for a structured/guided visit to the event – maximising the educational value.

Volunteers - making a difference

Alumni members play a special role in inspiring and engaging young people – giving them real role models who can provide practical support in helping them to think about their future careers.

At WorldSkills London 2011 you can help by:

- Acting as a skill interpreter providing an explanation of the competitions and the assessments taking place
