Four tours or routes have been indicated on this map which may be easily covered by car, starting either from Oviedo or Gijón. As terminal of the route a suitable place with a confortable hotel has been selected for accomodation at night and as a starting point for next day's back trip.

# GIJON

St. Lorenzo's beach is for those who visit it not only the broadest in the North, but also one of the most important in Spain. It has been of late years endowed with every commodity and indispensable amenity, it is therefore favoured during the season with the presence of chosen society as well as numerous summer resident from abroad. The city borders the beach in its whole length of two kilometres, and both the beach and city are encompassed in mid a wonderful and evergreen landscape, to which the City's Park and the sumptuous villas in the residential summer quarter of Somió lend a finishing streak. Summer with an average temperature of 19° C., is, by far, the best time for the full enjoyment of this beautiful scenery, it is also then that the city, and specially the more sumptuous and modern part of Gijón, is clothed in its best attire; on one side stand out the Labour University buildings, of which the city boasts as a model institution in Europe, on the other, several historic monuments may be seen together with important industrial centres, and further on «el Musell, a vast harbour, leading in the exportation of mineral products, chiefly coal. Gijon-115.000 inhabitants-is favoured every summer with an ever increasing affluence of foreign visitors, who make the best of its exceptionally mild climate, festivals, entertainements and other items of a varied nature offered to everybody in the city's program for the season

## OVIEDO

The capital of the province shines like a gem in the history of Spain. A stroll round the city will enable the visitor to perceive its brilliancy, sometimes of a literary, patriotic, scientific or religious kind, very often of an artistic value, and perhaps at times with a legendary tinge, but in any case of a strong impressive character.-The park, formerly a convent of the Franciscan Order, occupies to-day the centre of the more sumptuous part of the city and might well be taken as the visitor's starting point; in its shaded area one may yet see a romanesque porch, the only remembrance of the old and venerated convent church.-We will then proceed along San Francisco's Street, leading from the square in front, and will soon see, on our right, the University buildings and its patio of an autere neo-classic taste. -Further on, bordering both sides of the road, we come to several old palaces and manors, the former residences of high ranked families in Oviedo,-Toreno, Camposagrado, Marquis of Santa Cruz-, and the Law Courts palace, each showing an illustrating detail in balconies or coats of arms, or telling an interesting story.-In the heart of the old quarter stands the cathedral with its lofty and graceful spire, possessing a remarkable gothic cloister and the Cámara Santa, a small chapel with a magnificent series of statues in stone, of the apostles of the best romanesque period, this chapel conteins besides a rich legacy of many centuries of fervent piety and devotion in the form of venerated relics and of divers jewels of incalculable value, not only on account of the materials used in their making and decoration but more specially also for their artistic and historic import.—The visitor should perambulate through the maze of winding roads and lanes and he will not fail to remark many an interesting nook or sight.—San Vicente's cloister and museum with splendid collections, the small churches of Santa María del Naranco, San Miguel de Lillo and San Julián de los Prados should also be included in his schedule and will be precious landmarks in his musings of far gone days, he may perhaps construe the birth of the art of the early middle ages. - And last, see the Town Hall and the Provincial Council Palace (Diputación), which keep in their record rooms old books and historical documents speaking of the city's privileges and glories.
