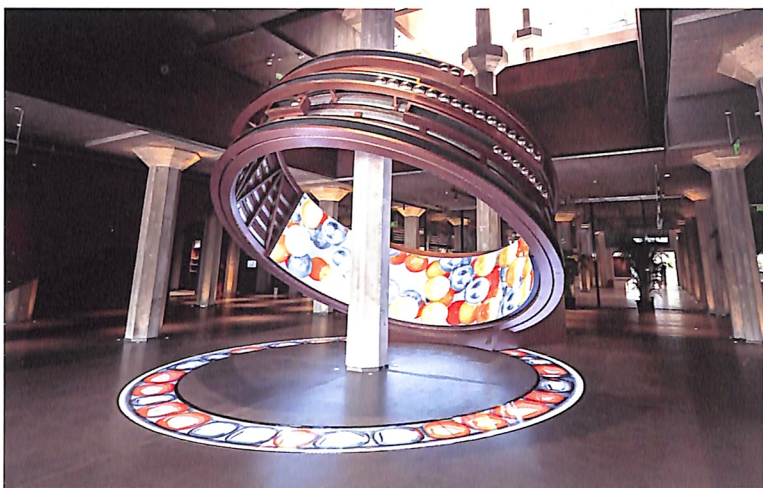

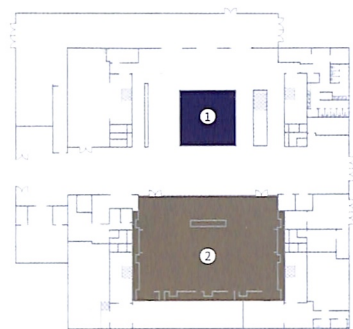


Introduction

Situated on the Left Bund in the Yangpu District of Shanghai, the WorldSkills Museum is the only physical museum recognized by WorldSkills International and also the world's first museum dedicated to vocational skills. Jointly developed by the Ministry of Human Resources and Social Security of the People's Republic of China, the Shanghai Municipal People's Government, and WorldSkills International, the WorldSkills Museum aims to become a center for skills demonstration, a platform for skills cooperation and exchange, a base for skills education for youth, and a literature center in the area of skills.

Highlighting the synergy of head, heart and hands, the WorldSkills Museum features six permanent exhibition zones: Tools and Our World, Celebrating a Successful Global Movement, Skills Development and China, Building a Better World with Skills, Skills and STEM, and Skills and the Industrial Revolution. With a collection of more than 2,000 valuable assets, the museum currently displays around 800 assets in its permanent exhibition. Visitors will learn about the past, present, and future of skills, understand the role of skills in advancing human civilization and discover China's breakthroughs and accomplishments in skills.

The museum building, formerly the Wing On Warehouse, a century-old cotton warehouse has been transformed into over 2,500 square metres of skills innovation and inspiration. Under the concept of "like-for-like renovation", the original walls, flat slabs, and octagonal columns with funnel-shaped capitals have been preserved, which epitomises Chinese elements, Shanghai symbols, and craftsmanship.

The Atrium, Temporary Exhibition Hall, and Café are located on the first floor (1F). At the centre of the Atrium stands the art installation World Engine. The seven sliding tracks represent the continuous flow of communication between cultures across the continents. Skilled citizens of the world work and collaborate, directly and indirectly, forming a grand and intricate system that drives global technological progress. This illustrates the WorldSkills' vision: "Improving our world with the power of skills".

The second floor (2F) features three permanent exhibition zones. Zone 1: Tools and Our World tells the story of tools, skills, and human progress. Zone 2: Celebrating a Successful Global Movement reviews the development of WorldSkills International and the WorldSkills Competition. Zone 3: Skills Development and China shows the significant role of skills and vocational education in promoting national prosperity.

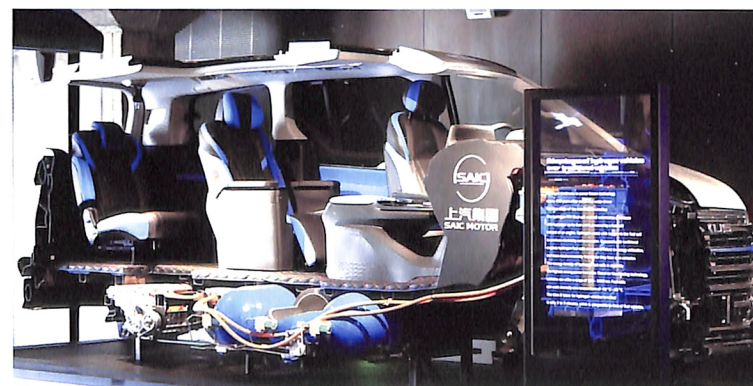

The third floor (3F) contains other permanent exhibition zones. Zone 4: Building a Better World with Skills explores the close connection between skills and social development. Zone 5: Skills and STEM highlights the important role of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics in skill development. Zone 6: Skills and the Industrial Revolution briefly reviews the four industrial revolutions and demonstrates that skills are key to sustainable economic prosperity and the improvement of living standards.

The fourth floor (4F) includes the Skills Practice and Experience Area, the Beauty Salon Experience Space, and the Tea Art and Floral Arrangement Experience Space. Tailored for young visitors, it offers a range of activities including skills training, education, development, and interaction. These are organized according to the six sectors of the WorldSkills Competition, inspiring young people to realize their dreams through skills.
