Dear René, Thank you for your letter of the 26th October 1984, & for the Berne-Minutes sent along.

I regret that I have delayed in reply but have been ill & receiving Doctors & Hospital treatment, also my Wife too. We suffered an accident on a Motorway M5 when returning from a Conference in the Torbay area, south England. My car became out of control, skidded & I braked - and finally the car rolled over & was completely wrecked although back onto its wheels, Vera & I got out unaided - but Vera was severely bruised & shocked, I was the same but also suffered 2 - broken - neck vertebrae bones & shoulder damage. We are recovering slow but sure and receiving very good attention from our Doctor & the Hospital and now feeling much better - but these things do take time, please do excuse my rough writing I cannot yet work the arm properly.
