SKILL OLYMPICS **SUCCESS IN** HEARTLAND OF INDUSTRY

THE UNITED KINGDOM, home to the world with its many ethnic groups, has been host to the greater part of the industrialised world in staging the '89 Skill Olympics at the National Exhibition Centre, Birmingham, in the heartland of British industry.

President Albert told the audience that the 39 years of the competition since the first was held in 1950 had proved the importance and positive results of the Skill Olympics in the social and educational aspects of vocational training. In that time, day of engagements in the international organisation had

tried to help young people perfect their knowledge and skills in their work.

He said: "We hope you young people from 21 countries appreciate everything that is being offered to you, the opportunity you have and that you show your professional skill and your interest in perfecting everything you have learned in your work.

"Your training must endure your whole life because it is an extension of your whole personality. In perfecting your work, which is of the utmost importance, you are contributing to the well-being of the community."

SPONSORS RISE

The sponsors of the materials, equipment and work stations for the competitors at the '89 Skill Olympics rose magnificently to the occasion when Halls 3A and 4 at the NEC were set up ready for the competitions. Acres of empty space were transformed in a few days into fully-equipped work areas for the contestants.

Along with the cash and clothing sponsors and others who have contributed to the event, they have made the UK hosting of the 30th International Youth Skill Olympics possible.

The 400 competitors had their first sight of the competition area last Sunday when they spent the morning familiarising themselves with the equipment and materials and preparing their tools. They also received briefings from the international technical

With the work completed on Thursday, the international juries took over, marking the work and passing their findings to the international secretariat for computer analysis. This will reveal the gold medallists who become the world champions in their skills and the silver and bronze awards for those who gave them a hard fight for the top awards.

Today the medal winners will be declared and they will receive their accolades at the closing ceremony at the Birmingham Hippodrome.


