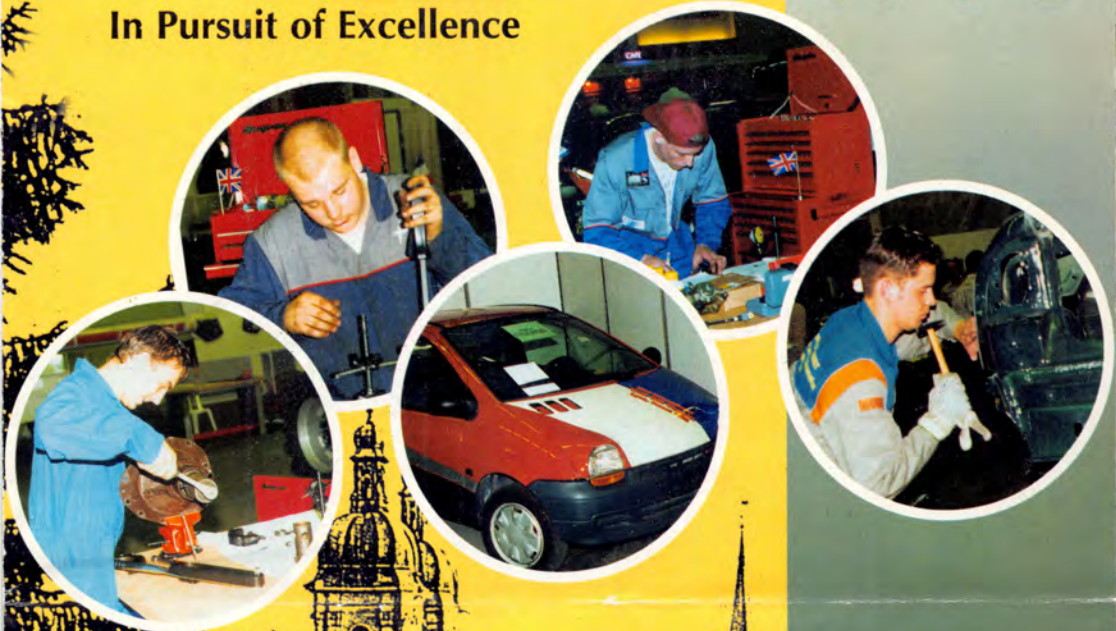

## National Automotive Technician Competitions 1996

### Competition Information & Rules

#### 1. The Competitions

1.1 These competitions are organised and co-ordinated by SKILLAuto Limited in close collaboration with UK-SKILLS.

1.2 SKILLAuto Limited will appoint National Competition organisers, examiners and adjudicators whose decisions will be final.

#### 2. Eligibility and Experience Required

2.1 The competitions are open to individuals born on or after January 1st 1975 who have at least 3 years formal training with related further education and practical experience in the relevant trade.

2.2 The competition will be based upon the relevant industry occupational standards and underpinning knowledge.

#### 3. Important Entry Requirements

3.1 Entries will only be accepted on the official entry form.

3.2 Entry forms must be fully completed and countersigned by the applicant's employer.

It is important to note that winners of these competitions will be required to undergo an extensive training programme prior to their entry to the Skill Olympics Competition which is to be held in Switzerland in 1997. This could result in the competitors being away from work for up to 12 weeks between October 1996 and July 1997.



#### 4. Competition Structure, Timetable and Expenses

4.1 The order of progress through the competition will be:

- Local Heats Written Paper
- Regional Finals Practical Work — 1 Day  
Duration
- National Final Practical Work — 3 Days  
Duration  
(26th — 28th September 1996)

4.2 Full board and lodgings will be provided to National Finalists for the duration of their stay. The winners will be fully sponsored for their preparation and trip to Switzerland.

#### 5. Communications

5.1 All communications will be with the employer.

#### 6. UK-SKILLS and the International Youth Skill Olympics

6.1 This competition is conducted in close collaboration with UK-SKILLS.

UK-SKILLS is the standard setting body for national skills competitions in the UK and is promoting the development of a national framework of skills competitions covering every industry sector. It is affiliated to the International Organisation for the Promotion of Vocational Training (IVTO) and organises the British entry to the International Youth Skill Olympics.

The International Youth Skill Olympics are held every two years in one of the 32 IVTO member countries. Competitions held over four days in 40 occupational skills are open to contestants up to the age of 22. Future events will be in St. Gallen, Switzerland in 1997; Montreal, Canada in 1999 and Seoul, Korea in 2001.
