Over the last 25 years Gothenburg has been proud to host of a number of world renowned events. Many magical memories have been created here, for participants, the public and for residents.

One of the city's biggest assets for hosting events is its compact city centre and centrally located arenas. Visitors have everything they are likely to want in the way of entertainment, culture, events, hotels and shopping, all within walking distance.

GOOD TO KNOW

Water: Tap water in Sweden is fresh, free and safe to drink.

Power Plug Adapter: The type of power socket used in Sweden is Type F; this socket also works with plugs C and E. The voltage is 230 V with a frequency of 50 Hz.

GREEN FACTS

- Gothenburg is the world's greenest hotel city. 86 % of the city's hotels are eco-certified
- About 86 % of public transports in the region are powered by renewable energy.
- Landvetter Airport is one of nineteen airports in the world that are climate-certified at the highest level of the Airport Carbon Accreditation (ACA) program. The airport is also environmentally certified in accordance with ISO 14001.
- The main Euroskills venue, the Swedish Exhibition & Congress Centre is certified by ISO 20121 and is powered by 100 % wind energy.
- The arena Scandinavium, is eco certified according to the Environmental Diploma and 100 % of the energy used is Eco labeled by "Bra Miljöval" i.e. "Good Environmental Choice"
- The amusement park Liseberg, is eco certified according to the Environmental Diploma and is powered by 100 % wind energy. Liseberg is also a proud owner of a wind mill.

Smoking: The city has a smoke-free bylaw and smoking is prohibited indoors

Driving: In Sweden you have to drive on the right-hand side of the road. Seatbelts are compulsory and headlights must always be on.

Climate: Sweden has a mix of warm and cold weather with temperatures of 20 to 25 degrees Celsius in the summer and 0 to -20 degrees Celsius in the winter.

Emergency number: General emergencies, Ambulance, Fire and Police: 112

- Airport coaches are run on RME, a biofuel produced from rapeseed.
- Gothenburg is a Fair-trade City since 2011. This award means that the city is actively committed to ethical consumption and chooses products manufactured with respect for human rights. A large number of cafes, restaurants, hotels and stores offer Fair-trade products.
- Gothenburg has plentiful clean drinking water on tap and the city's water monitoring program is among the most extensive and safe programs in Sweden.
- Gothenburg was awarded the Access City Award 2014 by the European Commission. The award recognizes and celebrates European cities that have shown exceptional good work with addressing accessibility issues.
- According to the Global Destination Sustainability Index Gothenburg is ranked among the top sustainable event destinations in the world.

Gothenburg welcomes you to its 13th Christmas City event, full of beautiful Christmas lights, holiday's adventures, and modern as well as traditional Christmas markets. Experience the three kilometre 'Lane of Lights' along the main boulevard to the amusement park Liseberg and visit the contemporary and traditional Christmas markets.

The first lights will be lit on November 11th as an appetizer to the Christmas city. The amusement park Liseberg will then open its gates on November 18th. Finally, all the Christmas ornaments and lights will be set for the Premiere on December 1st, opening the festivities in the city

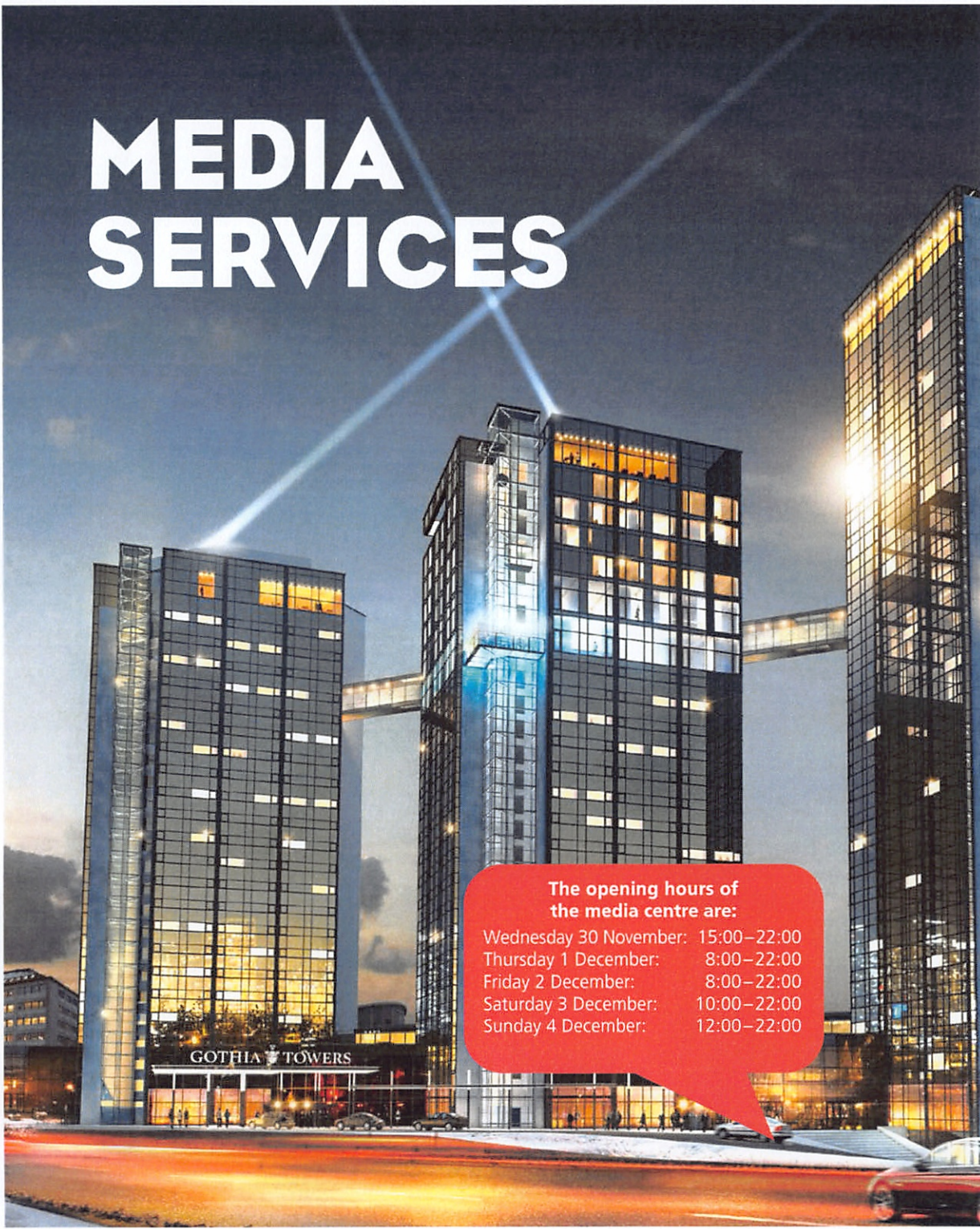

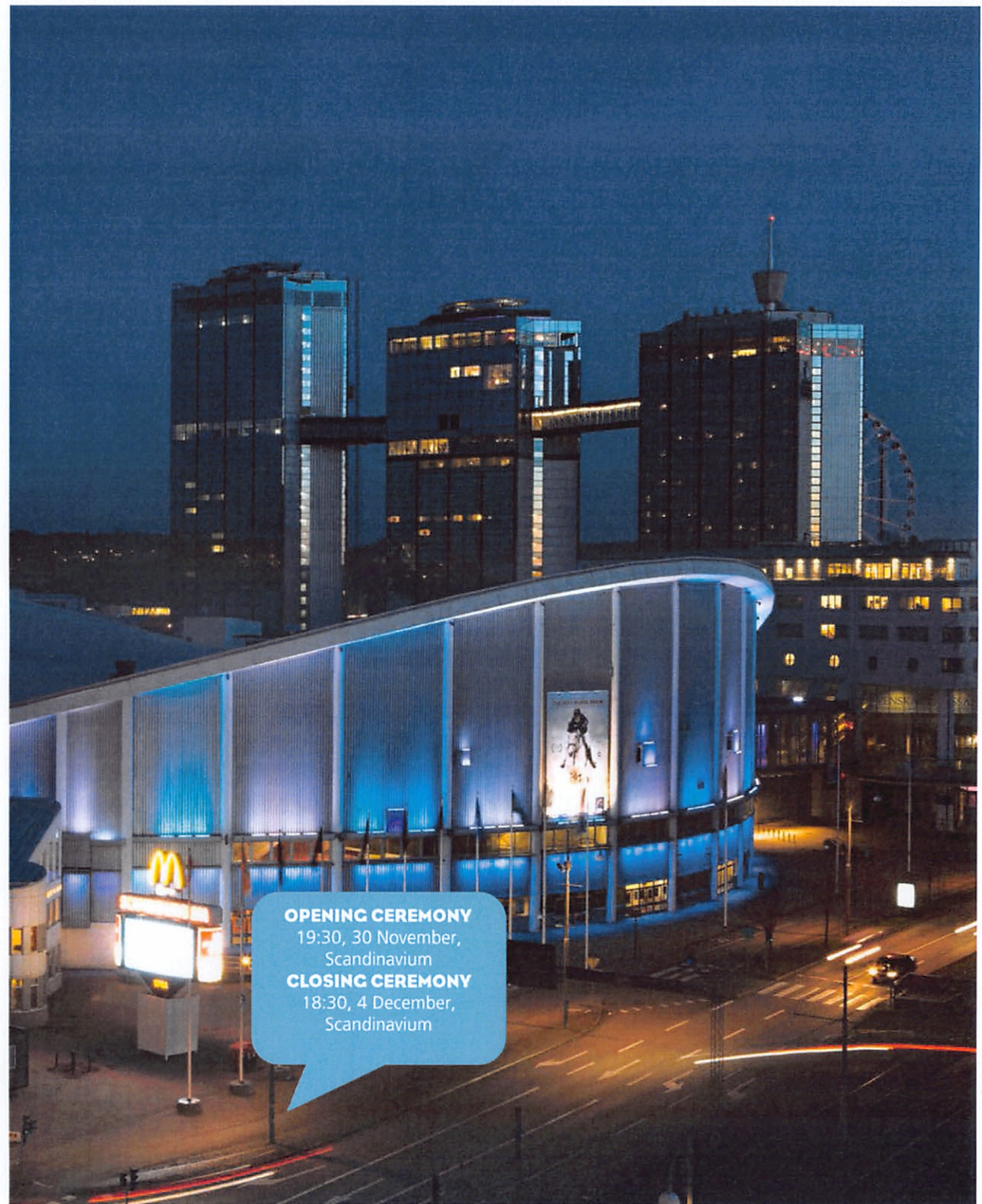
SWEDISH EXHIBITION AND CONGRESS CENTRE

The Swedish Exhibition and Congress Centre is one of Scandinavia's largest assembly points, which attract around 1.8 million visitors a year. It is one of Europe's largest, fully integrated hotel and congress facilities

The centre has nine exhibition halls, 60 meeting rooms, a congress hall for 1,500 people, eight restaurants, five bars and Scandinavia's largest hotel, Hotel Gothia Towers. The centre has an area of 41,000 m² for exhibitions and congresses, and each year about 30 exhibitions are held with 8,000 exhibitors. Festivities and banquets are held at the venue with up to 8,000 guests.

SCANDINAVIUM ARENA

The Scandinavium Arena is the third largest indoor arena in Sweden and accommodates sporting events, concerts, shows, exhibitions, trade fairs and corporate functions. The arena was built in 1971 and hosts over 700,000 visitors every year.

The medals are made to be a symbol reflecting the pride and joy in representing a profession through a partnership between the school, business and culture.

The artist Carolina Claesson has made the design with a strong link to the EuroSkills logo and the the actual production will be done through CNC Milling with the help of students at Lindholmens Technology School (LTG).

The Students at LTG are milling the medals one at a time where some of the medals then are sandblasted to obtain a special surface finish. One of the goals of the EuroSkills 2016 organization is to create opportunities for high school

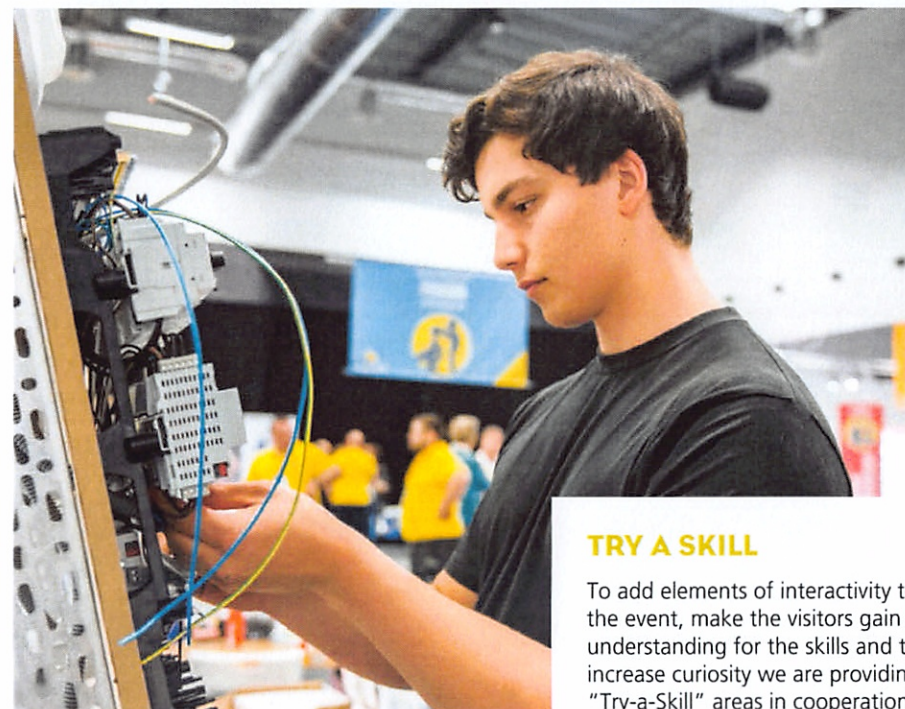
students to get a closer contact with actual workplaces and businesses so we are proud to be working with the school on this project.

TRY A SKILL

To add elements of interactivity to the event, make the visitors gain understanding for the skills and to increase curiosity we are providing “Try-a-Skill” areas in cooperation with our organizational partners. These partners are mainly industry representatives.

The “Try-a-Skill” areas will be designed by our partners and aim at getting young people to try a skill “hands on”. The partners are responsible for creating the activity, building the showcase, providing the necessary equipment, tools and materials needed for the activity. In addition, the partners are obliged to staff the “Try-a-Skill” area, preferable with young people/vocational students.

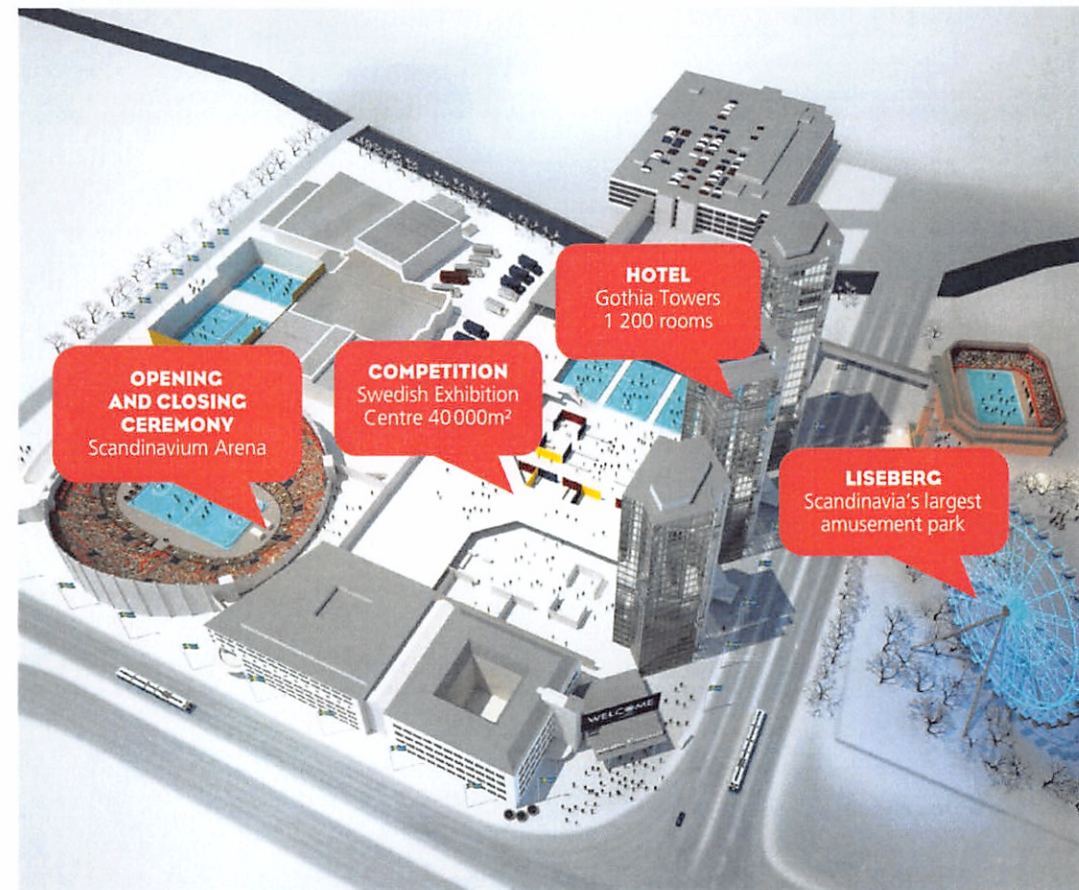
