The IVTO conducts the International Youth Skills Competition every odd year, and in this way:

- motivates young people to pursue further education and training relevant to their careers
- facilitates communication and contacts between vocational training organisations around the world
- encourages the exchange of young professionals among the Members
- promotes and markets the mission and goals of the Organisation.

Participation is open to both male and female skilled professionals from industry who are not older than 22 in the combetitition year











International Youth Skills Competitions

Over almost half a century, the , «Skill Olympics» have come to symbolise the pinnacle of excellence in vocational training. Every two years hundreds of young skilled people, accompanied by their teachers and trainers, gather together from around the world to compete before the public in the skills of their various their peers drawn from regional and national skill competitions held in over 30 countries.









The competition is more than a contest for medals



The experience and results of all the competitions provide valuable feedback both to the individuals and the systems and enterprises in which they are being trained. For some it is recognition for outstanding achievement, while for others it provides the motivation and knowledge to aspire to higher standards. The competitions are open to the public. Up to 200.000 visitors have participated.

For the onlookers it is a revealing experience to see highly competent young tradespeople in action. The competitions are particularly effective in the context of providing positive career role models for school aged youngsters.

In each competition trade, only one candidate may compete per country
